Unconventional Tour: Making Waves 2008 in Little Rock

Friday and Saturday evening, October 17th & 18th, at the Market Street Cinema, 521 Merrill Drive, something unconventional is coming to Little Rock.

From California, the Unconventional Tour: Making Waves 2008. will feature two unique and informative evenings of film showings, Q & A with the filmmaker, special guests, great new political music, plus audience participation in a "Free Speech Contest" judged by clap-o-meter, during Intermission. Films include several award winning documentaries: on Friday, "Electile Dysfunction" plus several shorts, directed by Penny Little; on Saturday, "9/11 Dust and Deceit" & "Rachel's Story".

Penny Little, Coordinating Director of People to People TV, who is spearheading the Unconventional Tour, says, "This is not just a tour. We want to inspire and mobilize people to get involved in the political process -- whether it's voting, boycotting, campaigning, becoming the media, demonstrating, running for office, doing something. We also want to have fun doing it and as Jim Hightower says, put the party back into politics!"

The PTPTV crew from Santa Barbara include Penny Little, Nik Green, and Dawn Perrine -- making their way from California, to Austin, Tulsa, Little Rock, St. Louis, Bloomington, Chicago. Inviting local musicians and special guest speakers is a feature of the tour, making each event different, unconventional and shaped by local input.

Penny Little and Nik Green are also musicians/performers, each coming from corporate record labels, joining together to form the electronic duo - The Away Team. Nik worked with Roy Harper and Jimmy Page on a project after the demise of Led Zeppelin, and is a film composer, having scored several films, including "9/11 Dust and Deceit" "Electile Dysfunction", "JFK II, (by John Hankey) - and many others. Penny was signed to Warner/Chappell in the UK and has toured the US, Japan, Europe as a singer songwriter. Her documentary films have played to packed houses in Europe, Australia, Japan, and the US. Dawn Perrine, a filmmaker in her own right, has been part of this People to People TV entourage since 2003, although she currently resides in Oregon.

The doors open at 6 pm. The Market Street Cinema is an independently owner-operated theater, which screens first run, award winning films
